1ST INTERNATIONAL YOUTH [MUSIC] CAMP IN LEIPZIG

The Music School of the City of Leipzig is sponsoring its first International Youth Camp with young musicians from Leipzig's sister cities. Young high school or college-age people will work on and create chamber music and form a youth orchestra of the sister cities.

This orchestra performs the opening concert of the Bach Festival Leipzig 2001 in the St. Thomas Church under the direction of Professor Georg Christoph Biller, the *Thomaskantor* who heads the *Thomanerchor*. The concert includes cantatas from Johann Sebastian Bach and the St. Thomas Cantata by Heinz Werner Zimmermann.

During their ten days in Leipzig, the students will also perform music from their home countries during "country evenings".

After months of hard work, Dr. Ute Eisele leads a delegation of 13 student musicians from Houston to participate in the youth orchestra and attendant activities. You have an opportunity to come to their last practice session on May 16 before they leave for Leipzig (see item above).

The Freundeskreis Leipzig-Houston has planned a party in honor of the participants from Houston on May 26, at 10:00 a.m. at the Moritzbastei in Leipzig.

We are grateful for the support of Lufthansa German Airlines who donated a round-trip plane ticket for one of the students. The HLSCA Board gave a grant of \$1,000 towards the cost of this project.
